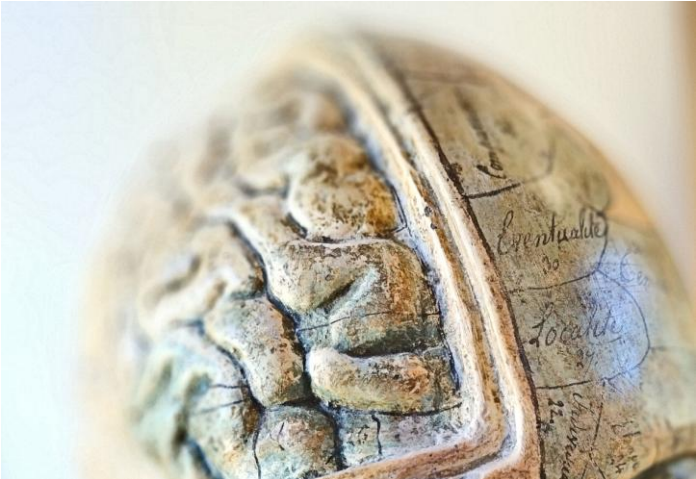

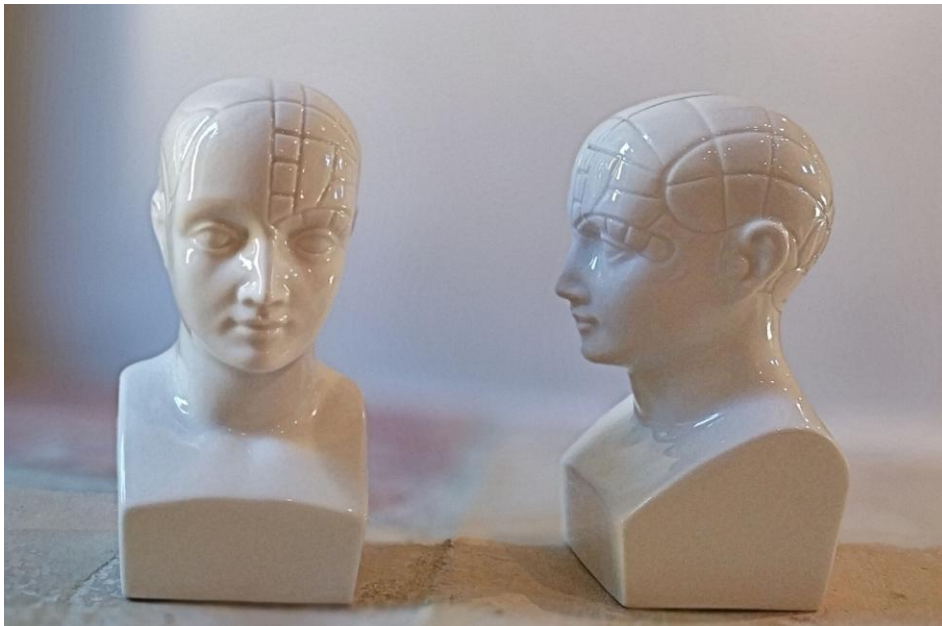

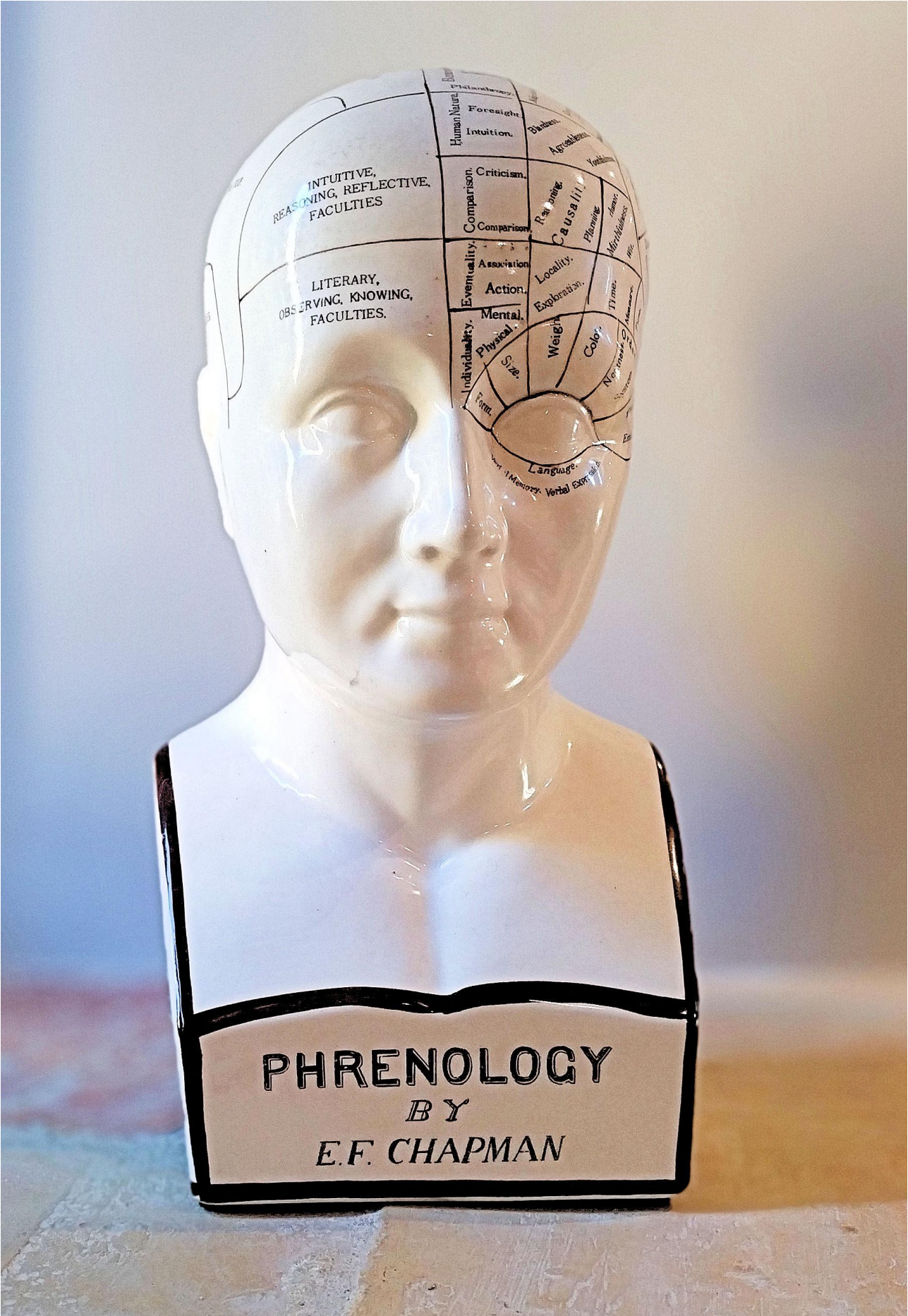


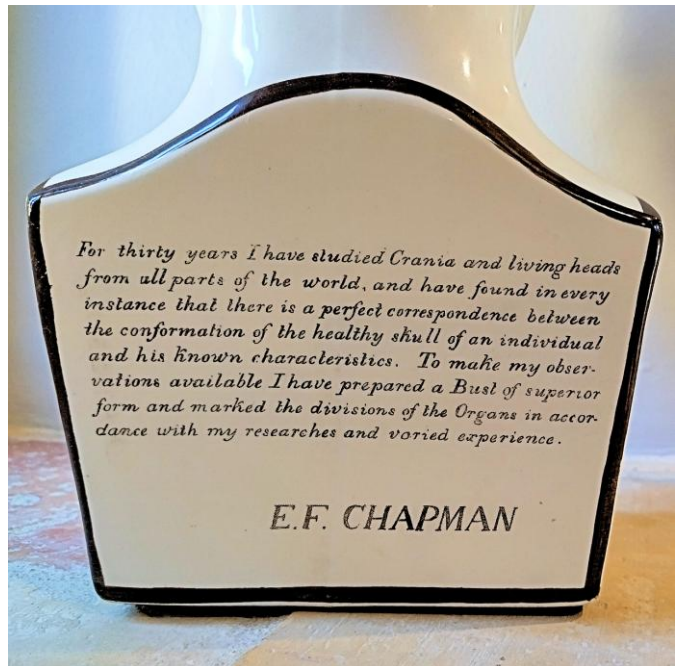
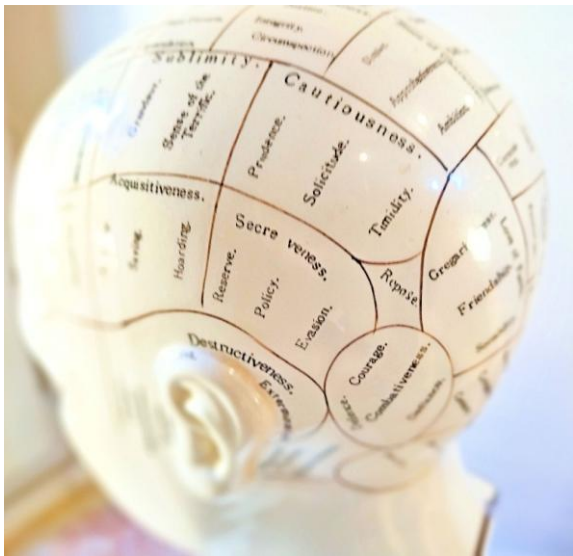
Head 11. Height: 14cm



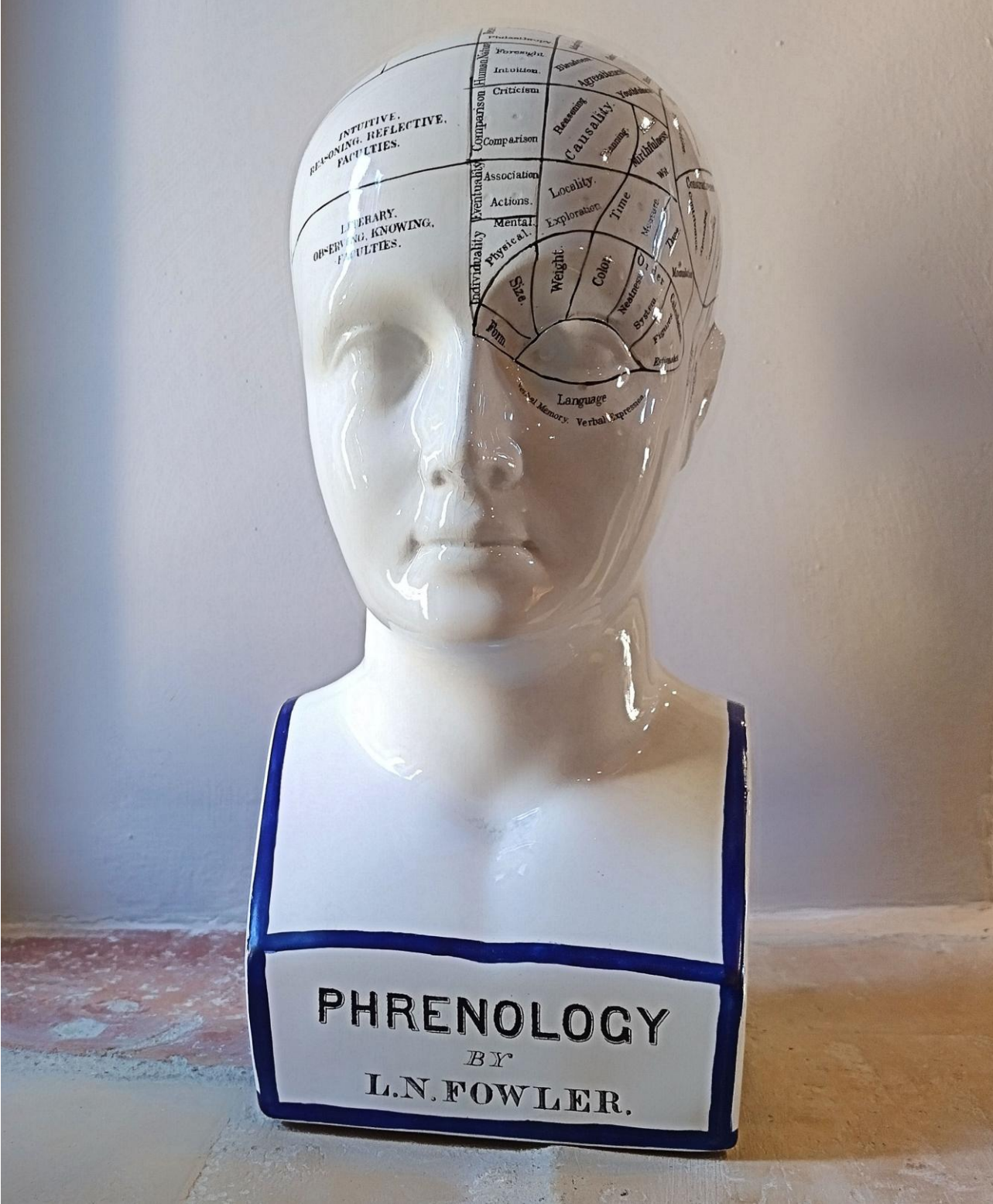


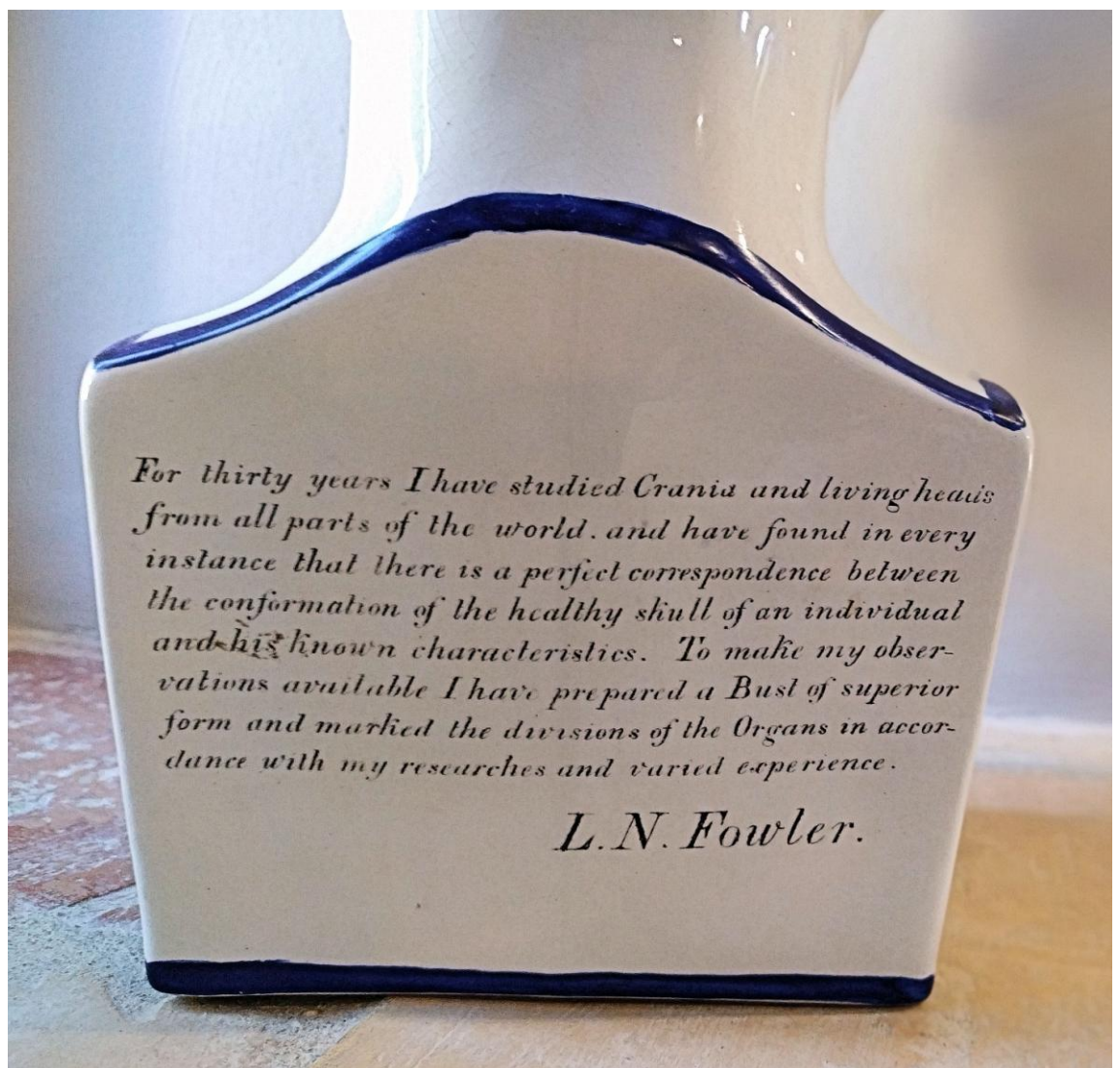
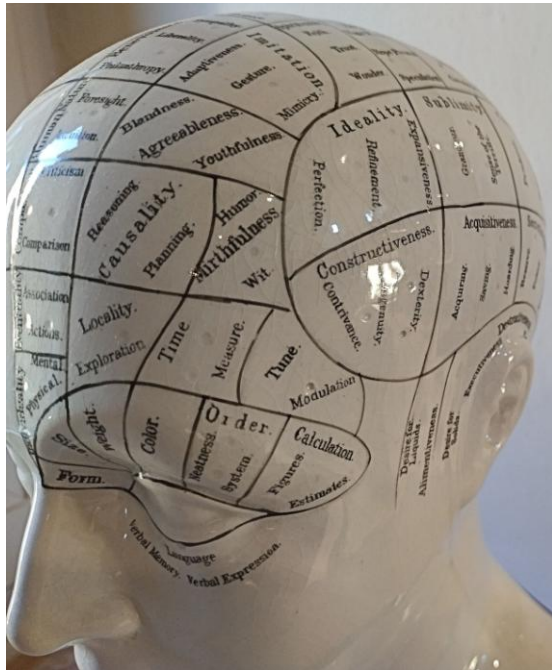
Head 12. Height: 29cm

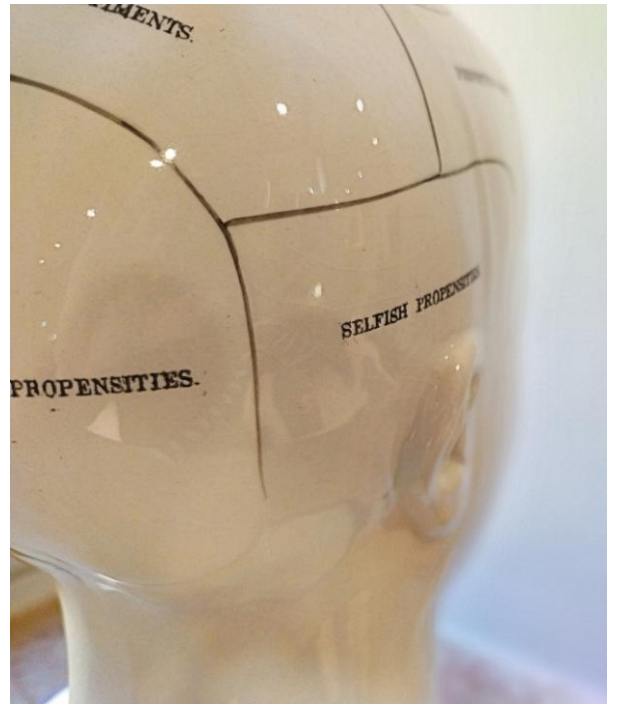




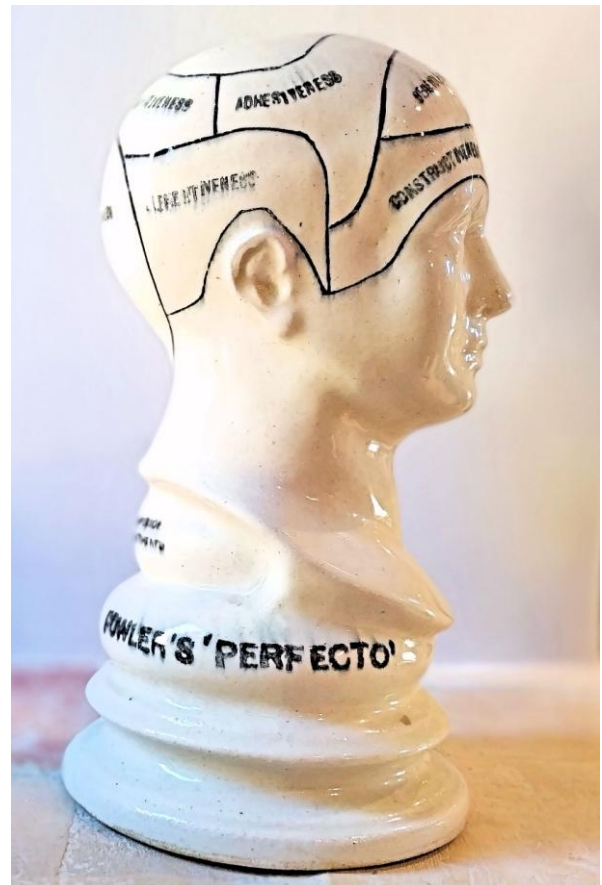
Head 13. Height 29 cm



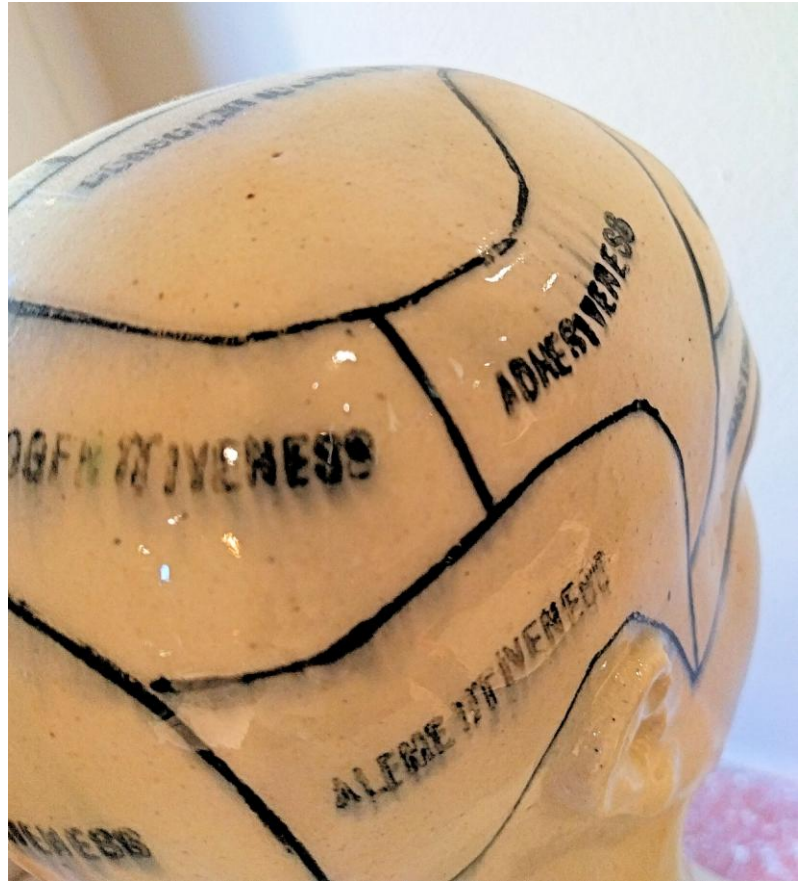
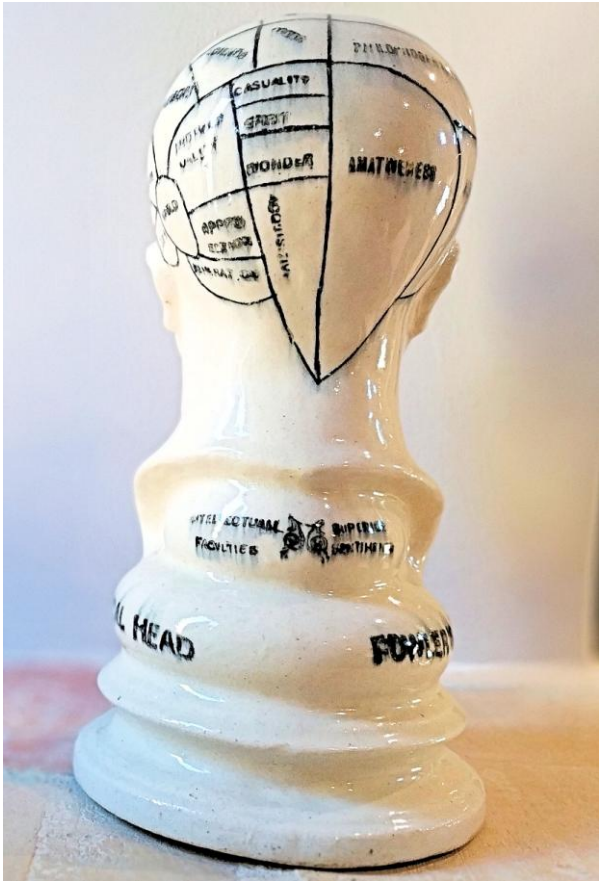
